As we approach the month of March, I'll be using this time in my sermons to take us through some of the key events that happened to our Savior during the last week of His earthly ministry. That period of time-from His entering into Jerusalem on a donkey to His resurrection from the dead– has been referred to as "the greatest week in history." It was this week that all four of the gospel writers focused upon the most as they told us about the life of Christ.

This last week in His ministry showed our Savior at His best, yet it also showed us His creation at our very worst. Whether we want to admit it or not, we relate most to the hypocritical priests and Pharisees, or to the self-serving Roman leader Pilate. All of those people were used to having things done <u>their</u> way, for that is what our fallen human nature screams for the most: "I want what <u>I</u> want!" (Sounds like the average 2 year old, doesn't it?)

It is only through surrendering our lives to Jesus that we wake up from our slumber of selfishness and start to look at what really matters in life, which is to spend our lives pleasing God. So, as we go through the last week of the life of our King, He'll show us all a mirror. Yes, we'll see ourselves as we are now (which will show us all an ugly but truthful reflection), but, even more importantly, He'll show us all as we <u>will be</u>, as we surrender to His will.

Our future will be a glorious one, but only because our Savior chose to walk down that difficult path during the last week of His ministry. Let's strive to remember what He did for us all, and be eternally grateful.


